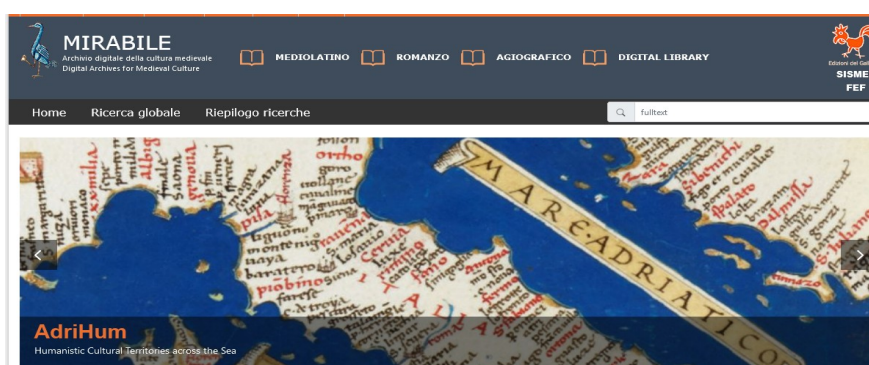


## AdriHum. Humanistic Cultural Territories across the Sea

Research and studies on humanistic culture in the Adriatic area are progressing rapidly, led by Silvia Fiaschi's team at the University of Macerata. Within the digital framework of **Re.Medi.Hum. Renaissance Mediaeval and Humanistic Digital Library**, the digitale archive **Adri.Hum.Texts. Texts and Textual Traditions of the Adriatic Humanism (14th-16th Centuries)** is now available, featuring 250 textual, onomastic and lexical cataloguing items.

The complementary project **AdriHum. Humanistic Cultural Territories across the Sea** is currently in the testing phase. It will enhance the integrated archive of Mirabile in the Medieval Latin DB section, promoting the interconnection between the two research infrastructures that complement each other.



The status of the project was presented at a seminar held on 9th September by Lucia Pinelli as part of the PhD programme in Humanism & Technologies at the Department of Humanistic Studies of the University of Macerata. The seminar was entitled *AdriHum nell'Universo di Mirabile*. Click [HERE](#)

Among the authors newly cataloged by AdriHum with significant acquisitions, notable mentions include Daniele Clario and Elio Lampridio Cerva (Ilija Crijević / Helius Lampridius de Crieva / Aelius Lampridius Cervinus). The latter has been identified as the possessor of a previously unknown copy of the *Liber glossarum* (see the open-access essay by S. Fiaschi, *Interessi lessicografici di Elio Lampridio Cerva*, published in «Colloquia Maruliana» 2023: read the [ESSAY https://hrcak.srce.hr/file](https://hrcak.srce.hr/file)). Two of his poems *De Bibliotheca*, cataloged in AdriHum, were selected as Latin texts for translation in the 7th edition of the *Certamen Philelfianum*, a translation competition of Latin humanist texts for Italian high school students. The event concluded with an awards ceremony on May 15, 2024 (<https://philelfiana.unimc.it/premiazione-certamen-philelfianum-vii-edizione/>): a chance to share the world of Mirabile with both the educational community and the general public!
