PREFACE

Micrologus. Nature, Sciences and Medieval Societies is a peer-review Journal of the International Society for the Study of the Middle Ages published by the SISMEL Edizioni del Galluzzo (Florence). The subtitle summarizes the general objectives of what *Micrologus* intends to be.

Micrologus as Journal having a rhythm of publication limited to one number a year it became necessary five years after the publication of the first volume of *Micrologus* to open a new series – *Micrologus Library* – with the objective to publish other collective volumes as well as monographs and critical editions of medieval texts.

The present volume presents four cumulative indexes. The first (pp. 3- 58) lists all the tables of contents of all 32 *Micrologus* volumes (1993-2024); the second, of all 126 *Micrologus Library* volumes (1998-2024) (pp. 59-168). This collection of tables of contents is followed by a third index, that is the alphabetical list of the authors of all the articles or monographs published in *Micrologus* or *Micrologus Library* (pp. 169-311). The author's name is followed by the title of the corresponding article or monograph. The fourth index (pp. 312-536) lists the signatures of the manuscripts (latin, greek, arabic etc.) mentioned in the indexes of manuscripts published in *Micrologus* and *Micrologus Library* volumes.

The first index lists 1869 titles of articles and monographs, the second 1010 authors, the third 6213 manuscripts.

For all those three indexes this volume replaces the index volume published in 2012 concerning *Micrologus* vol. 1-20 (1993-2012) and *Micrologus Library* vol. 1-45 (1998-2012) and *Micrologus* vol. 1-28 (1993-2020) and *Micrologus Library* 1-99 (1993-2019).

Names of Libraries and signatures of manuscripts have been standardised following the rules applicable in *Medioevo latino* (SISMEL Edizioni del Galluzzo) and *Mirabile. Digital Archive for Medieval Culture* (www.mirabileweb.it). *Micrologus* is abbreviated by **M**; *Micrologus Library* by **ML**.

I would like to express my deep gratitude to Silvia Agnoletti, S.I.S.M.E.L., whose knowhow and commitment made this volume of indexes possible.
